G.1 <u>Approve 2013/2014 Appropriation Act Amendment for General</u> <u>Fund Budget</u> Mr. Sederlund

RECOMMENDED MOTION: "That the Chippewa Valley Schools Board of Education adopt the following resolution to approve the General Fund Budget for the 2013/2014 fiscal year. Further request that the reading of the resolution be waived."

RESOLVED, that this resolution shall be the General Fund Appropriation Act of Chippewa Valley Schools for fiscal year 2013/2014 to provide for the expenditure of the appropriation; and to provide for the disposition of income received by Chippewa Valley Schools.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the total revenues and fund balance estimated to be available for appropriations in the General Fund of the Chippewa Valley Schools for the fiscal year 2013/2014 originally adopted June 17, 2013 and amended January 27, 2014 be amended as follows:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that \$142,208,706 of the total available to appropriate in the General Fund is hereby appropriated in the amounts and for the purposes set forth below:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the revenue from the millage levy of 18.000 mills on non-homestead and non-qualified agricultural property be certified and be used towards the District's 2013/2014 operating expenditures. As provided by in the Act related to the Michigan Business Tax, Personal Industrial Property is exempt from the 18 mills and Personal Commercial Property is exempt from 12 of the 18 mills.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that no Board of Education member or employee of the school district shall expend any funds or obligate the expenditure of any funds except pursuant to appropriations made by the Board of Education and in keeping with the budgetary policy statement hitherto adopted by the Board. Changes in the amount appropriated by the Board shall require approval by the Board.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Superintendent and his designee are hereby charged with general supervision of the execution of the budget adopted by the Board and shall hold the department heads responsible for performance of their responsibilities within the amount appropriated by the Board of Education and in keeping with the budgetary policy statement hitherto adopted by the Board.

This appropriation act resolution is to take effect on approval by Board of Education.

RATIONALE: The 2013-14 second amended budget for the General Fund has been prepared by the Administration. The second amended budget is generally done near the end of the fiscal year to make adjustments to be in compliance with the Uniform Budgeting and Accounting Act and to update grant related revenue and expenditures to correspond to grant budgets submitted to the state.

For 2013-14, there are three major adjustments that are included in the second amendment for the purpose of complying with the Uniform Budgeting and Accounting Act that are unique to 2013-14.

- Revenues were increased primarily because of the MISD Medicaid payment of \$326,000.
- Expenditures were increased primarily because of the increase in utilities cost (\$336,000) and the K-5 textbook adoption (\$351,650).

Overall, the total revenue variance from the 1^{st} amended budget is a positive 0.33% while the total expenditure variance is a negative 0.59% of the 1^{st} amended budget.

Details of budget adjustments for 2nd amended budget are included in supporting documents.
